The Dawson County Commissioner's Court will hold a public hearing on the proposed budget for FY2024 on Tuesday, September 5, 2023 @ 4:00 p.m. in the Dawson County Commissioners' Court Room on the 4th floor of the Dawson County Courthouse.

“This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by \$1,155,119.59 a 15.0016% increase. The property tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year is \$141.56.”

At the conclusion of this hearing, the Court will be able to consider adopting the budget for FY2024.

Statements required in notice if the proposed tax rate does not exceed the lower of the no-new-revenue tax rate or the voter-approval tax rate, as prescribed by Tax Code §26.061.

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2023 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Dawson County from the same properties in both the 2022 tax year and the 2023 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Dawson County may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Dawson County is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2023 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 5, 2023 at 4:00 P.M. at Dawson County Commissioners Courtroom , 4th floor, 400 S 1st, Lamesa, Tx 79331

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Dawson County is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Dawson County Commissioners Court of Dawson County at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.
